Tourism In South of Italy


76% of the tourism companies in the south of Italy lost 29.6% of their customers and 31% of their turnover in spite of 609 new beds in the province of Agrigento and improvement of the tourist offer.

These data came from the 'Business tourism' publication of Isnart, based on figures provided by the Union of Chambers of Commerce and the National Observatory of Tourism.

Southern Italy and the Islands are the most affected, while the North East is able to minimize the loss of customers and turnover at around 25%. In the centre of the country only 57.6% of the companies were affected.

In conclusion, due to the crisis, 3.4% of the Italian tourism enterprises have been forced to close their doors. In the South and Islands, where the uncertainty is greater, 60% downsized their investment plans.

Despite the difficulties, tour operators do not allow themselves to be overwhelmed by pessimism, while adopting an attitude of extreme caution. Most of them feel that this year the trend of customers and revenue should be stable. Negative expectations are shared by 17.5% of firms that expect a reduction in the number of customers and a 18.1% decrease in turnover. Meanwhile, two new hotels Villa Calandrino of Sciacca and The Lighthouse Guitgia of Lampedusa were newly opened. In 2012 there was an increase of 609 new beds with a percentage increase of 3.4% compared to 2011.


Following Cleopatra's footsteps


